Housetraining Chart



This chart is a useful way to chart your puppy's progress. The reason for using a chart is to identify daily patterns and track the difficult times of day that your puppy needs to be watched more closely or crated. Circle the location of accidents on the chart to quickly identify difficult spots. If the number of accidents does not decrease over time, you should look at your daily routine and use better management strategies. As always, keep your puppy in a long-term confinement area if you might be gone longer than your puppy can currently hold it. This is a sample page filled out.
